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## Host Families Required – Japanese Student Visit:

We are pleased to announce that this year we will again be hosting a group of Japanese students through the Overseas Cultural Exchange Program in Balaklava and Clare. Some of our families may remember Horizon hosting Japanese students a few years ago. We will have a group of 12-14 students (approximately 14 to 16 years old) arriving on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> August and leaving on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> August. We will need families to host them.

Families will need to provide the students with their own room, all family members over the age of 18 must have a current Working with Children Check and will receive monetary compensation. Families can host more than 1 student, but they will require their own room each. If you would be interested in hosting a Japanese student, please contact the office.
