There will be no Chapel this week due to the students participating in the House Team Games.

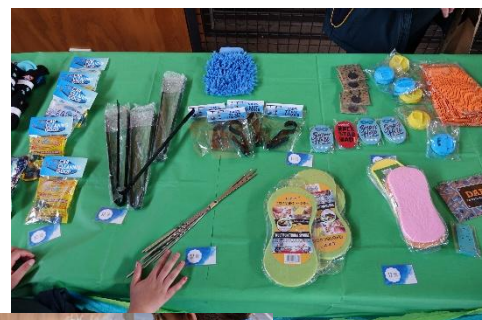
Premier's Reading Challenge:
